

Dual Enrollment & Early College High School Program with Massasoit

Overview: Starting in 10th grade, Southeastern students have the opportunity to enroll in college classes for FREE through Massasoit Community College. Students who qualify for the Early College High School Program will be allowed to continue taking college classes on Massasoit's Brockton campus.

<p>Who is dual enrollment for?</p> <p>When is it offered?</p>	<p>All students in good academic standing at Southeastern are eligible to take dual enrollment classes after school at the high school.</p> <p>Dual Enrollment Classes are offered every fall and spring, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays 2:45pm – 5:45pm</p> <p>Early College Courses are offered Monday through Friday from 12pm – 5pm</p>
<p>How do I get started?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Attend an Information Session 2. Complete a dual enrollment application 3. Complete a course registration form for Speech and College Success 4. Attend a new student orientation
<p>What are classes like?</p>	<p>Classes offered at Southeastern are the same classes offered at Massasoit Community College. Students earn high school and college credit.</p> <p>Unlike high school classes that are slower paced and stretched out over the course of the year where you receive a lot of support from the teacher, college classes may require some self-teaching and they move fast.</p>
<p>What if I start and find that it's not for me?</p>	<p>If you start class and realize it is not right for you, you may drop the class. If you drop during Massasoit's drop/add period, the class will not appear on your permanent college transcript. If you drop after drop/add, it will appear as a W (withdrawal) on your transcript.</p>
<p>Is it really FREE?</p> <p>What is the benefit of dual enrollment?</p> <p>What are the drawbacks?</p>	<p>YES! Tuition, fees and textbooks are cost-free to students</p> <p>Experience taking a college course; college credit(s); impressive high school transcript; rigorous content</p> <p>College-level work can be challenging. You must be willing to commit to working hard and independently</p>
<p>How do these classes equate to Southeastern classes?</p>	<p>A semester of college is equivalent to a year-long course at the high school level.</p>

How will college classes be weighted?	Students receive AP credit for their college courses (with the exception of the Student Success Courses)
What colleges will accept these courses and credits?	ALL public colleges in Massachusetts accept these credits as transfer credits. While we cannot tell you what exactly will/will not transfer, MOST other colleges accept these classes for transfer credits. It is important for students to look up schools and majors they are interested in and check course requirements for their intended major.

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
