## Early College Joint Committee February 2021 Context and Considerations

## Comparative Groups

- Early College (EC): Students identified as program participants in SIMS, often represented in blue
- School Peer: Non-participating students who attend the same school as EC students, often represented in orange

## Comparative Years

- We have data for 2019, 2020, and 2021
- Depending on the visual, one, two, or three years may be used
- Note that 2020 outcomes data and 2021 demographic data have presumably been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic

## Data Interpretation

- Rates: Percentage of students representing a measure, can be found outside of bars
- Counts (N): Number of students that constitute rate calculations, usually inside bars




## Enrollment in Early College has continuously increased:

Number of EC Students (SIMS)




## The majority of EC students are Black or Latinx:

EC Students by Race and Ethnicity (SIMS)






#### Percent of EC Students Economically Disadvantaged (SIMS)

EC Students by Gender (SIMS)




EC maintains high MassCore completion rates through pandemic:



EC MassCore Completion Rates (SIMS)


#### MassCore completion rates are comparable across racial groups:

FAFSA Completion Rates as of February 1st each year



EC College Enrollment within 6 Months of High School Graduation


#### Black/Latinx college enrollment is disproportionately affected by pandemic:




#### EC College Enrollment within 6 Months of H.S. Graduation by Race

Top 10 Destinations of EC Graduates in 2019




#### Top 10 Destinations of EC Graduates in 2020
