Design Principles

Under the Early College Designation put forth by the Massachusetts Board of Higher Education (BHE) and Board of Elementary & Secondary Education (BESE), approved designated early college programs in Massachusetts will align with the following design principles:



1. Equitable Access

targeting underrepresented students in higher education



4. Connections to Career

through workplace and experiential learning experiences



2. Academic Pathways

that are well integrated and aligned with college and career



5. High-Quality & Deep Partnerships

between high schools and colleges



3. Robust Student Support

in both academics and advising

Common Language: The Early College Experience

Cohorts of students:

- Take at least 12 credits of strategically sequenced college courses during their regular (or intentionally redesigned and integrated) high school day, at no cost to themselves or their families
- Receive enhanced academic and non-academic guidance and support prior to beginning, and during, college coursework to ensure that they both successfully complete rigorous courses and thrive in the college environment
- Learn how their guided academic pathways are related and connected to career opportunities
- Benefit from being part of an Early College community that eases the transition from high school to college
- Graduate from high school with a significant number of college credits, habits, and skills needed to
 be successful in college and career, increasing the likelihood they will continue with college after
 high school and reducing the cost and time to degree completion.

MA EC Designation

- Designation represents a contract, including:
 - Program accountability and performance evaluation, collection and sharing of data, funding (support grants for Designated K-12 partners and tuition reimbursements for IHE partners)
